CHANGES TO JEFFERSON PARISH BIDDING PROCEDURES

The Jefferson Parish Purchasing Department would like to make vendors aware of the following changes:

DEDUCTIBLES: The Parish Attorney with concurrence of the Director of Risk Management have waived the deductible section of the Terms and Conditions for all Invitations to Bid, until further notice.

PROTESTS: Only those vendors that submit bids in response to a solicitation may protest any element of the procurement, in writing to the Director of the Purchasing Department. Written protest must be received within 48 hours of the release of the bid tabulation by the Purchasing Department. After consultation, the Parish Attorney's Office will then respond to protests in writing.

BONDS:

A 5% Bid Surety is due with the bid submission.

A Performance Bond in the amount of 50% of the contract amount is due at the signing of the contract.

LICENSE REQUIRED:

1. Louisiana department of agriculture business license
2. Commercial pesticide applicator license for right-of-ways (category 6) and aquatic herbicide applicator license (category 5) must be submitted with the bid submission.

The copy must be of the front and back of each license. Failure to submit the required copies will be grounds for rejection.

Successful Contractor shall submit regularly updated employee lists/license throughout the terms of this contract.

Contractor acknowledges that, pursuant to Jefferson parish Code of Ordinance Section 2-155.10(19), Contractor, and all of Contractor's subcontractor(s), has an affirmative duty to cooperate with the inspector general in any investigation, audit, inspection, performance review, or hearing.

SPECIFICATIONS:

ARTICLE 1. SERVICES AND REQUIREMENTS

The contractor shall furnish all labor, material, equipment, and qualified supervision to control weeds and undesired vegetation on drainage canals, ditches, servitudes, and

levees on the east and west bank of Jefferson Parish. This spraying will include treatment of all unwanted broad leafed and grassy weeds, vines, and brush with the intention of elimination of undesirable vegetation. The spraying will be controlled to release low growing grasses such as Bermuda or centipede on slopes and right-of-ways of certain canals as listed in Article 2 of this bid. All aquatic weeds, rooted or floating in the water or on the bottom width must be sprayed by boat or other appropriate means. No payment will be made for any work performed in or on any canal not listed in this contract, except changes made by written change order.

After completion of spraying on any areas, and after the required waiting period for its effectiveness to be determined, any areas that indicate poor control or show no effect of the previous spraying shall be retreated within five (5) working days of receipt of telephone notification followed by written notification by the department at no additional cost to the parish.

Contractor shall be responsible for daily verbal communication with the Drainage Department to advise where work is being performed on those days on which spraying operations are being carried out. Weekly written work reports of spraying performed during the previous week will be submitted by the contractor to the Drainage Department. These reports will include names of canals, ditches, servitudes, and levees sprayed, square feet (or acres) covered, names of herbicides used and gallons of spray mix used. These reports shall be submitted promptly each Friday by fax, email or hand delivered to the east bank Rheem Building field office at 4901 Jefferson Hwy. Suite "D" and the West Bank La 18 field office at River Park Road, Bridge City.

ARTICLE 2. ASSIGNED CANALS, DITCHES, AND LEVEES

Attached is a list of all canals, ditches, and levees within the parish which may be maintained by contract. Canals are broken down into two spray programs which will require different chemical applications per month. Program 1 will be applications during March, May, July, and September. Program 2 will be applications during April, June, and August. Program 3 will be applications during January, April, July, and September. Each month's application must be completed within that calendar month. After the contract has been awarded and executed by the parish, the contractor shall be responsible to verify the acreage shown. Contractor shall contact the Drainage Department supervisor or the Drainage director and after consultation they shall make changes that are agreeable and acceptable to both parties. Verification of acreages shall be completed by the contractor prior to the start of any work to be done under this contract.

ARTICLE 3. MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT

Only brand names can be used for slopes and flats applications.
A non-ionic wetting agent will be required on all applications

Required products for monthly applications for slopes and flats:

The option for September spraying will be selected by the Drainage Department supervisor based on existing conditions in August. Only one option will be used.

September application (option 1)

1. Outrider herbicide – at a rate of 1 ounce per acre
2. Bayer pastora – at a rate of 1.25 ounces per acre
3. Weedestroy am-40 – at a rate of 64 ounces per acre
4. Syngenta barricade 65wg – 2.3 lbs./acre with a wetting coverage of 40 gallons of water per acre

September application (option 2)

1. Outrider herbicide – at a rate of 1 ounce per acre
2. Bayer pastora – at a rate of 1.25 ounces per acre
3. Weedestroy am-40 – at a rate of 64 ounces per acre
4. Bayer esplanade 200sc – at a rate of 3 ounces per acre with a wetting coverage of 40 gallons of water per acre

Required products for aquatic spraying per acre as needed:

- Weedestroy am-40 broadleaf weed control – follow manufacturer's recommended application rates for control of aquatic weeds
- Aquatic glyphosate – grassy weed and broadleaf weed control such as aquamaster, rodeo, or aquaneat. Follow manufacturer's recommended application rates for control of aquatic weeds.
- A non-ionic wetting agent will be required on all applications

Required products for algae control per acre as needed:

Sepro k-tea algaecide using the following rates

12" deep water = 1.6 gallons

18" deep water = 2.5 gallons

24" deep water = 3.1 gallons

30" deep water = 3.75 gallons

*depth of water to be determined by Jefferson parish prior to treatment

Required products for duckweed control per acre as needed:

- Syngenta reward aquatic herbicide diquat. Follow manufacturers recommended application rates. A nonionic wetting agent is required on all applications

Required products for aquatic spraying for emergent weeds per acre as needed
(Option 1):

- Basf clearcast at 128 ounces per acre per 100 gallons of water

Required products for aquatic spraying for emergent weeds per acre as needed
(Option 2):

- Sepro galleon at 5 ounces per acre

Required products for aquatic spraying for submersed weeds per acre as needed
(Option 1):

- Basf clearcast at 207 ounces per acre per 100 gallons of water

Required products for aquatic spraying for submersed weeds per acre as needed
(Option 2):

- Aquathol k (aquatic herbicide). Follow manufacturers recommended application rates for control of submersed weeds. Depth of water to be determined by Jefferson Parish prior to treatment.

Required products for aquatic spraying for submersed weeds per acre as needed
(Option 3):

- Sepro sonarone aquatic herbicide. Amount of product to be used to be determined by Jefferson Parish prior to treatment.

**Required products for aquatic spraying for submersed weeds per acre as needed
(Option 4):**

- Sepro galleon at a rate of 5 ounces per acre-foot. Amount of product to be used to be determined by Jefferson Parish prior to treatment.

Required products for canal bank fertilizer

- Regal Harness 30-0-0 liquid slow release fertilizer. 15 gallon per acre rate. Plus Regal Ensemble 0-20-20 at a rate of 15 gallons per acre. Apply with a total of fertilizer and water at a minimum of 80 gallons per acre.

Spot spraying item is the complete turnkey price, including all equipment, labor, and herbicides for application by calibrated handheld spray equipment of 3 oz. Bayer Derigo herbicide plus 6 fl. Oz. of Roundup PROMAX per acre. A non-ionic wetting agent will be required for spot treatment applications. A Jefferson Parish representative will determine limits of spot treating.

Line items for individual products at per acre are included to establish a bid price should the need to increase the application rate of any of the programs on a given month becomes necessary. These items are not to be used in place of the program items.

Contractor must maintain at minimum one (1) properly equipped roadside Spray Trucks and four (4) other pieces of spray equipment consisting of some combination of Tractors, Atvs, Rtv's, necessary to accomplish the work required. An appropriately equipped motor boat and air boat on each side of the river for spraying of assigned canals not accessible to ground operated equipment is also required. Contractor will be required to include gps navigated boomless sprayers capable of spraying behind vehicles and widths from 5 to 35 feet and computer controlled flow rate components on all equipment. Spray rigs must be capable of spraying from 20 – 50 gallons per acre.

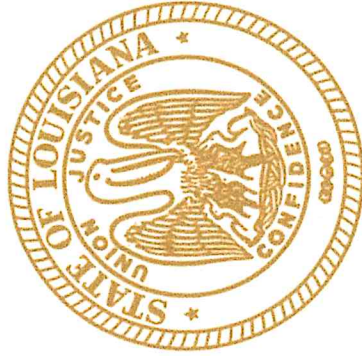
